Please to remember the 5th of November! But not everyone enjoys fireworks at this time of the year.

If they're likely to cause distress, it can help to find out when local firework displays are happening, and to ask neighbours if they are planning to set off fireworks, and if so what time. Most local authorities advise the fireworks cannot be set off after midnight. If you hear fireworks going off after this time and it's causing distress, try calling the non-emergency police number 101. If you have a hearing or speech impairment, use the textphone service on 18001 101. If you need an update on a report, please use the Webchat facility. If you use British Sign Language (BSL) you can contact 101 using a Video Relay Service provided by SignLive.

As usual there will be the warmest of welcomes along with the delicious refreshments and a speaker, Jo Mortimer of Ocean Aspire Training & Consultancy. Her talk will be 'Be a Lifesaver - Learn CPR'

A cardiac arrest is when someone's heart suddenly stops pumping blood around their body, causing them to fall unconscious and stop breathing. In the UK, fewer than 1 in 10 people survive an out-of-hospital cardiac arrest. CPR and defibrillation can double someone's chance of survival. Together we can push up the survival rates.

Using the British Heart Foundations 'Call, Push, Rescue' approach, it will give you the skills and confidence to administer CPR and understand how your actions can make the difference.

Topics covered:

- Understanding why CPR is needed and how it can be applied
- Demonstration of CPR and the use of a Defibrillator
- Practice in a comfortable and safe environment if you wish



September Coffee Morning

Sara, Nicky and Rebecca came from the Pickwell Foundation to tell us something about what they do. They explained how the foundation works to support charities and organisations within the UK that are working with displaced people, and with those addressing the climate emergency. In North Devon they support refugees, providing advisory teams, stewarding community volunteer groups, helping with re-settlement schemes. The people they help have been compelled, for various, often traumatic, reasons, to leave their home countries. The Foundation works hard to ensure that they settle into their new environment, and feel safe. The three ladies reported that here in North Devon the community has been particularly welcoming and supportive, which should make us all feel proud. 



As we walked about Silkenworthy Farm on a sunny afternoon, farmer Anne May shared a depth of knowledge and experience on regenerative farming methods that she and husband Alex use. Their passion for creating a farm that grows happy healthy livestock with land rich in natural goodness shone through her talk.

Pointing out their herd of cows she explained the science behind their breeding to produce cows whose size and weight are optimised. They are under the least amount of stress and have small calves, making calving so easy that they can birth themselves. These contented cows are rotated every few days- as are their sheep.

Soil quality benefits from not being grazed too low because whatever proportion of herbage is nibbled down the same length of root dies and long roots mean more nutrients in the soil. Long roots also create channels for rain which reduces water logging as well as feeding plants. Anne took us into a herbal ley field, lush with grasses including rye and a range of nutritious herbs including chicory, to admire the soil under a spade's depth. Rich! Wormy! Almost sweet smelling!

This is just a sample of what we learnt and to cap it all we were able to buy meat fresh from the farm. My son, who didn't know the origin of his lamb cutlets, took a couple of bites and said 'this tastes like a happy lamb'. The proof they say is in

One we last did a long time ago, a pleasant moorland stroll on good paths without any steep climbs, but with wide views.

You can get to the start either via Hillsford Bridge or via Simonsbath, each a similar distance. I prefer the Simonsbath route for its easier driving. On first entering Simonsbath turn left on the B3223. Continue up for 2km until you get into open moorland. Then after 3km use the first car park you meet, on the right.

Our version is the Hollywood film from 1953, starring Marlon Brando and James Mason along with John Gielgud. It was nominated for a Best Picture Oscar, with Brando's brilliant turn as Mark Antony also getting a Best Actor nomination. The film did collect an Oscar for art Direction, while Gielgud and Brando picked up Baftas. Run time is a shade over 2 hours.
